

## New Youth Protection Training

The BSA is rolling out new mandatory "Youth Protection Training (YPT)" to all adult leaders. This course replaces the former YPT training that is no longer recognized beginning 1 October. The new training encompasses Venturing and Exploring Youth Protection. Therefore, those videos are no longer available. Now is the time to get your registered adults certified with the new training. The old YPT certificates are not acceptable for re-chartering in the fall. Avoid problems and get your leaders re-certified now. The course is available online. Or, once someone in your unit has completed the class, they can teach a live class to the rest of your registered adults. For more information, contact Jose Martinez, the Polaris District Director.

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## Fall Recruiting Kickoff

The 2018 Cub Scout Recruitment Summit is being held Tuesday, 24 July from 7:00 PM to 8:00 PM, at Santa Clara High School. The high school is at 3000 Benton Street in Santa Clara. Every pack recruiting chair needs to attend this meeting. By attending, you are going to learn the best and latest practices that ensure your Pack has a great fall recruitment including recruiting new adult volunteers. You are also going to see samples of the latest available recruiting materials. Successful fall recruiting is key to getting more families in your unit. This is a great opportunity to learn about:

- Promotion & advertising techniques to market your Pack;
- Conducting effective (and FUN) joining events;
- Recruiting more help;
- Exciting school classroom or lunchtime promotions; and
- The New Lion Program (Cub Scouts for Kindergarten age youth).

This year, a special emphasis is recruiting for Family Scouting.

Now is the time to:

1. Secure a recruitment coordinator for your pack
2. Encourage boys to invite their friends to summer pack activities
3. Conduct a Pack program planning conference. Prepare a calendar to share with new families in the Fall.
4. Order your recruiting materials. They can be ordered online at <https://fs10.formsite.com/svmbc/form592/index.html>.

If your unit participates in the “Be a Scout” service on the Internet, this is a great time to update your unit’s information there.

Some of the recruitment methods that packs have used include:

- Fliers
- School boy talks (classroom visit, assembly, lunchtime talk, after school presentation)
- Yard signs for the school (with permission of the principal) or in their yard
- Stickers
- Pack information sheet that highlights meeting times, contact information, & major activities the pack conducts throughout the year
- Peer to peer - cub scouts can invite their friends
- Work with school to be included in the school newsletter, website, etc.

Your District Director, Jose Martinez is available to help you figure out the recruiting tools that work for your pack.
