MASTER OF CEREMONIES

DAVE HOLT

In 1974, Dave earned Eagle Scout rank in Troop 3, Columbia, MO – the “oldest troop west of the Mississippi” where he also joined the Order of the Arrow. Dave helped found Saratoga Troop 581 in 1999 where he has served as CC, Eagle Adviser, ASM, and SM. On February 1, 2019 Dave helped found Saratoga girl Troop 582 where he served as SM until the end of 2022, and now serves as ASM. Dave has served as the Polaris District Committee Chair for 2018, 2019 and 2020 and as Polaris Membership Chair in 2017. Under his leadership Polaris District grew membership in 2019 at a healthy 9% growth rate. He has been a MB Counselor for most of the past 20 years and has also served as a Unit Commissioner beginning in 2017. Dave has been a champion for family scouting in the council. The Girl Troop Leader meetings he hosted helped propel Polaris District to be the top district in the nation (2019 and 2020) in both number of girl troops and number of female scouts in Scouts BSA. Dave is happily married to Reggie Holt who has served in GSUSA as troop leader for three troops and as Saratoga Service Unit Membership Chair. Their children are all Scouts. David (34) earned Star; Tony (26) earned Eagle with 3 Palms; Casey (22) earned GSUSA Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards; and Lucy (17) earned GSUSA Bronze and Silver Awards, is a member of the inaugural class of female Eagle Scouts with 4 Palms. Tony and Lucy are both OA members.

Professionally, Dave is a retired serial entrepreneur and technology executive. He has served as a C-level executive in both established and start-up companies for much of the past 30 years. He was the founding member of two pioneering organizations advancing system architecture and multimedia. In his career, Mr. Holt has served as an Executive Producer at the Walt Disney Company, President and CEO of Lightspeed Logic, VP & GM at ATI, and Founder, VP Engineering, & President of Chromatic Research; Mr. Holt has also held various executive management positions at Genetic Networks, Comparative Biosciences, Amiato, Hive7, SHOgraphics, and Convex Computer Corporation. Mr. Holt earned a BSEE from the University of Missouri and an Executive MBA from Southern Methodist University.



GUEST SPEAKER

MICHAEL S. MALONE

MICHAEL S. MALONE is an award-winning journalist, the author of two dozen books, and television producer and host. He also is Dean’s Executive Professor of Professional Writing at Santa Clara University.

Malone joined the Boy Scouts of America in 1965 in today’s Silicon Valley Monterey Bay Council. He earned his Eagle in 1968 and then served as a chapter commander in the Eagle Scout service organization, the Knights of Dunamis. He was a founding member of the National Eagle Scout Association, an organization he officially announced while on the staff of a National Jamboree.

In 2001, Malone became Assistant Scoutmaster and Eagle Mentor of Troop 466 in Sunnyvale, a position he still holds. He also has served on the Council Board for a decade, including as Vice President of Marketing. With Troop 466, he has supervised the creation or restoration of five BSA Historic Trails and mentored more than 100 Eagles. He also has written about Scouting for the Wall Street Journal and is the sponsor for the NESAs journalism scholarship. Malone is best known in Scouting for his best-selling history of Eagle Scouting, Four Percent. He has delivered the annual Eagle Scout address at the Boy Scout Museum.

Malone is a Silver Beaver, a NESAs Outstanding Eagle and a Distinguished Eagle Scout. He is particularly proud of being the father of two Eagle sons.

AWARD RECIPIENTS



CATHY HAMILTON

Cathy was first introduced to Scouting when her older brothers were involved in the program. She was only 7 when her brother, Gary, earned his Eagle, but she does have one not-so-fond memory of a Camp-o-Ree in Santa Cruz and an encounter with banana slugs! She re-engaged with Scouting as an adult volunteer when her husband, Geoff, recruited her to help him with the Tiger Den when their second son, Lincoln, was a first grader. They took over the Pack the following year when the Cubmaster stepped down. Cathy has led the Council Cub Camp program for the past three years. She is always looking for ways to improve and expand the Cub Camp offerings, to make them better, to reach more Cubs, and to support her team. Her creativity led to the development of Camp Inside Out, which engaged Scouts during the pandemic, helping them

get outside and have Scouting experiences despite the inability to hold traditional Day Camps. This unique online offering had Scouts attending from many different states, as well as from our Council. Cathy has led classes at University of Scouting, run booths at Scout-o-Rama, helped at Cub-O-Ree, worked at Adopt-A-Campsite/Hi Sierra, and helped with Fall into Fun Cub Scout Family Overnighter. She has been the co-director of Family Camps for four years, with her husband, Geoff. Outside of Scouting, Cathy has developed an after-school arts program at the elementary school that encourages youth to follow their passion to learn and create. In addition to her volunteer efforts, Cathy works full-time for Ventana Wildlife Society, a non-profit organization that is dedicated to conserving native wildlife and their habitats through science, education, and collaboration.



CHRIS MCGUGAN

Chris learned the values of Scouting on his journey to Eagle, and he is passing that legacy on to his children and the Scouts with whom he volunteers. Don Marselle, who served with him in Troop 340 and Pack 340, paid this tribute to Chris: "Chris's home and his time are always open to Scouts. If it is Pinewood Derby season, Chris's garage will be a sea of supervised activity as Cubs get their cars ready for the big day. If the Scouts in Troop 340 need swimming tests, Chris lines up sessions at the local swim club to help them with the tests. If there is a need, Chris steps up to make it happen." Chris has held many roles during his time as a volunteer with Boy Scouts. He has served as Den Leader, Cubmaster, Assistant Scoutmaster, Merit Badge Counselor, and SVMBC Board Member. He is now serving as Council President, Silicon Valley Monterey Bay

Council. Professionally, Chris is CEO of Televerde, a global sales and marketing company. The company's unique business model provides career opportunities to individuals in disempowered communities, specifically incarcerated women. Chris lives in San Jose with his wife Allison and their three children. In addition to his volunteer work with Scouts, he is an advisor to Parents Helping Parents and to the Televerde Foundation.



DAVID LO

In 2015, David wanted to enroll his then foster son, Jason, into the Cub Scouts. The family joined Pack 163 after meeting them at the Milpitas International BBQ Festival. Within a few weeks, he jumped in as Tiger Den Leader without any knowledge of Scouting. After a fun-filled year, David was asked to take over as Cubmaster, where he enjoyed serving for three years. At one point, the pack grew from about 10 to 63 Scouts. During that same period, David helped the Coyote Creek District as Fall Recruitment Chair and then District Membership Chair. He was very proud of the district when it ranked #4 in the nation in the number of female Scouts and female Scouting units. AWARDS AND RECOGNITIONS

LIFESAVING RECOGNITIONS

To recognize registered youth and adults who have performed an attempt to save a life or to recognize notable acts of service that need not involve attempts of rescue or risk to self, but put into practice Scouting skills and/or ideals.

Jeremy Xiang

On August 9, 2022, 15-year-old Jeremy Xiang was on a trip to St. Thomas Seabase when he noticed 1 person was struggling to swim back to the boat against the current and wind and was being swept out further away. The Captain realized that this man was not getting any closer and called for someone to help him. Without hesitation, Jeremy volunteered and jumped into the ocean with a pool noodle and fins. He swam out to the man and they both used the pool noodle to stay afloat and swim back to the boat. After fighting against the current and making it about halfway back, another Scout jumped into the water to help them. The 3 of them held onto the pool noodle and swam as hard as they could. Tired and exhausted, all 3 made it back to the boat. Jeremy is awarded with the Council Certificate of Merit on February 25, 2023.

TORCH OF GOLD

The Torch of Gold is a council award given annually to an adult Scouter for dedicated work for youth, particularly Scouts, with disabilities. It is not an award that is earned by simply fulfilling specific requirements. It is given in recognition for service in multiple areas for many years.

SILVER AWARDS

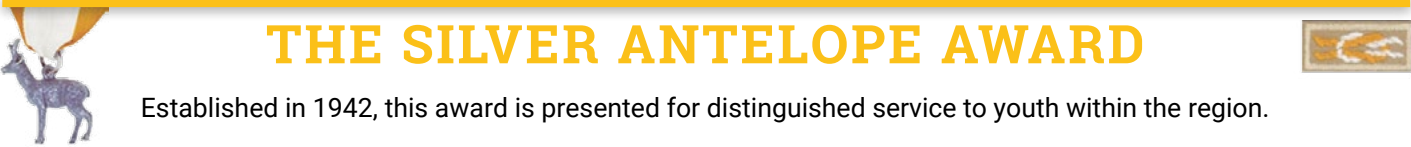

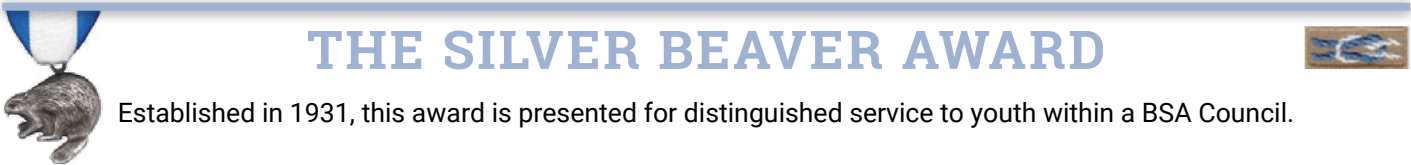

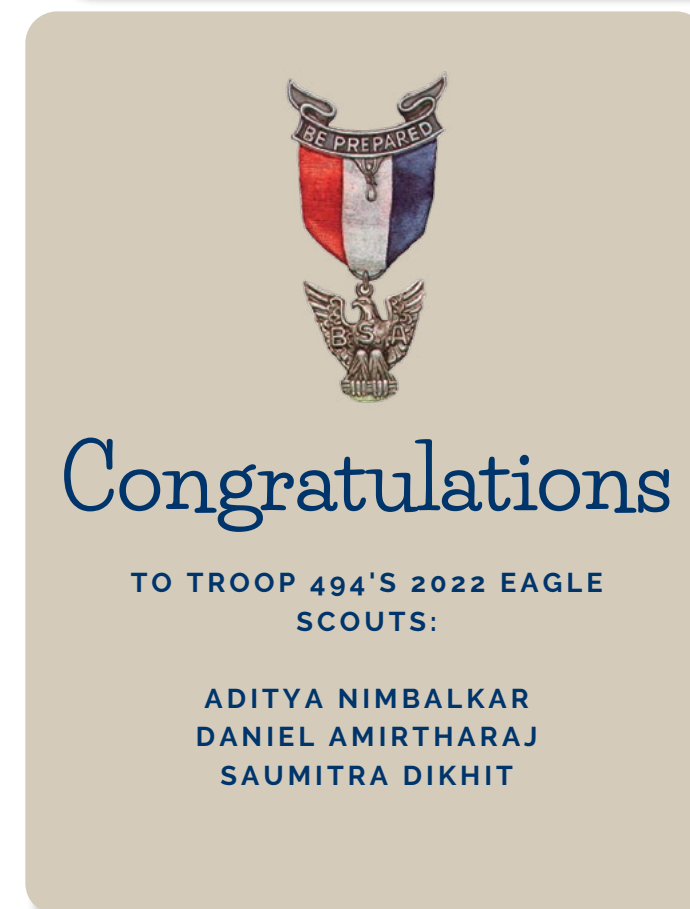
