# **2023 ANNUAL REPORT**





#### A MESSAGE FROM THE KEY 3:

2023 was an exciting year for SVMBC as we continued to make our mark as one of the premiere Scouting Councils in the nation. Our Scouts, leaders, Board of Directors, donors, and staff all set the pace for another remarkable year of achievement and record performance as we all did our part to live and emulate the Scout Oath and Law.

In highlighting our collective achievements, we finished in the top five in the nation for ethnic diversity and top six in the nation for youth retention. Female participation in Scouting now represents 22% of our total membership. Participation in Scout-O-Rama doubled to serve over 13,000 attendees. We had record attendance at Camp Hi-Sierra with over 18,000 camping days and over 17,000 camping nights, and we laid the framework for more inclusive outreach targeting our most underserved young people including Hispanic youth and individuals with Special Needs.

In 2023, our Scouts earned nearly 7,000 rank advancements and over 14,000 merit badges. More than 300 Scouts attained the rank of Eagle Scout. In service to our Scouts, just over 4,155 adult volunteers stepped up to provide leadership, direction, and guidance.

Through our fundraising campaigns, we achieved record revenues through our popcorn sale (over \$1.2M), Friends of Scouting (\$1.3M), total support (\$5.9M), and our Distinguished Citizen Dinner. In addition, we were able to secure a \$1M cash gift for Camp Chesebrough.

As we move forward in 2024, we encourage you to join with us to continue to build on this momentum in service to our area young people. Together, we will strive to do our best to do our duty in helping to shape young people of character who will become tomorrow's leaders. Thank you for all you do in support of Scouting and SVMBC!



Financials reflective of 2023 end of year, pending annual audit cycle




#### **INCOME**
