Scouting for Food is an annual food-collection drive, and one of the many service projects the BSA has conducted since 1910.

870,000 Bay Area residents and a *quarter million* residents in our council geography lack adequate access to food. Scouts can help make an impact by participating in the annual Scouting for food drive.

This annual effort for Scouting in the Greater Bay Area is coordinated in November

The plan is simple:

- 1. Pick up door hangers at the Council Service Centers in October.
- 2. You can participate as an individual, family, or unit.
- Select the area where your unit will distribute door hangers in your neighborhood the weeks of October 19th to November 1st. Links to an online map and instructions are on our Council Website for Service: <u>https://www.svmbc.org/activities/service-projects/</u>
- 4. Pick up the food left outside of the homes on November 2nd after 9:00 am, and deliver it to a local food bank or pantry (see reverse for more info).
 - Please obtain permission before handing out door hangers at Apartment Complexes, Condominium Complexes, Gate Communities, or other similar housing complexes.
 - Please make sure to stay within the SVMBC Boundaries. Our neighboring councils will be doing their own Scouting for Food Drives and we do not want ot compete with them.
