

PARTICIPANT REQUIREMENTS

- Be at least 13 years of age when the course begins
- Be a currently registered member of Scouting unit
- Be First Class rank or higher and have taken ILST* (Scouts BSA) or ILSC* (Venturers).
- It is recommended to have at least one year of camping experience.
- Have unit leader recommendation.
- Provide a complete BSA Medical Form parts A, B & C

*ILST and ILSC (Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops/ Crews) is the unit's version of leadership training. The name can differ from unit to unit.

WHAT HAPPENS AT NYLT?

During the first day of NYLT, participants are put into patrols with a staff member as their Troop Guide. Throughout the week, they will do activities together, learn together, and make lifelong friends.



Each day the patrols will rotate responsibilities and will learn simple tasks like running a flag ceremony or making a presentation. They work as a group to make things happen and learn why it is important to bond as a team.

Patrol Members play games that involves trust, teamwork, communication, and many other leadership skills. Throughout the course, participants learn why these skills are important as well as how to develop and maintain them.
