What is the Silicon Valley Monterey Bay Council?

For more than 115 years, Scouting has built future leaders by combining educational activities and lifelong values, with fun and adventure in the outdoors. In central California, Scouting continues to impact families and our communities by serving more than 11,000 youth and their families in 4 counties: Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, San Benito, and Monterey.

The Silicon Valley Monterey Bay Council (SVMBC) is chartered by Scouting America to deliver the Scouting program throughout central California. Our Council is comprised of an Executive Board made of our area's top business and community leaders, a professional staff to provide support and more than 4,000 volunteers who donate their time and talent to deliver this life-changing program to our youth.

What is a District?

The SVMBC is divided into 7 geographic Districts that serve the youth, families, and volunteers in that area. Coyote Creek District is east San Jose. Pioneer District is Santa Clara, Campbell, Los Gatos, Monte Sereno, Redwood Estates and Cambrian Park. Polaris District is Saratoga, Cupertino, and Sunnyvale. Quicksilver District is Gilroy, Morgan Hill and the San Jose neighborhoods of Willow Glen, Blossom Valley, Almaden Valley, and south San Jose. San Benito District is all of San Benito County. Loma Prieta District is all of Santa Cruz County. Santa Lucia District is all of Monterey County. Your District is supported by a volunteer District Committee Commissioners, District Executive, and Council staff that give leadership to your units on recruiting new Scouts, raising money to continue the



Scouting program, training leaders, providing fun activities, and coaching volunteer leaders to give you the best Scouting experience.

What is a Unit?

The word "unit" is a generic term to identify a Scout group. Scouts are organized into units depending on their age, or gender. Your unit belongs to a church, private school, civic group or some other group of people in your community (also known as a Chartering Organization).

Cub Scouts belong to units called Packs. Each Pack is divided into smaller groups called Dens. A Den is a group of six to eight Cub Scouts. All of the kids in your Den are in the same grade and may even go to the same school. Dens allow the kids to get to know each other and better engage in activities that would be difficult to accomplish in the larger Pack meetings.

Scouts BSA Scouts belong to a unit called a Troop. Inside the Troop, Scouts are divided into smaller groups called patrols. Empowering Scouts to be leaders is what Scouting is all about. The Scouts in the Troop develop their own program, run the meetings, and achieving their goals.

TIPS FOR PLANNING AN EXCELLENT SCOUTING PROGRAM IN YOUR UNIT

Plan what to do

- Select activities that will help accomplish your unit's goals and help youth complete advancement requirements.
- Get all the parents/youth together to brainstorm ideas.
- Use Scouting literature such as the <u>Den and Pack Meeting Resource Guide</u> or <u>Troop Program Features</u>, youth books, and Roundtable resources.
- Bring personal calendars, school calendars, and your chartered organization's calendar to avoid double booking.
- Use this Program Planning Catalog for great local activities.
- Get ideas from the youth.
- Use the <u>Guide to Safe Scouting</u> (helps you plan what training is needed and which age appropriate activities are right for your group).
- Brainstorm on large paper or a white board so everyone can see how it all flows together.

Fund your Program

- Determine all the expenses throughout the year (registration fees, *Scout Life* subscriptions, annual charter fee, unit equipment purchases, summer camp/day camp, Camporee, Pinewood Derby, monthly den, pack, patrol, troop activities, etc.).
- Identify sources of revenue to pay for the expenses (Council Popcorn Sale, activity participation fees, monthly dues, etc.).
- Share the budget with all the families.
- National budget templates are available for Cub Scouting, Scouts BSA, and Venturing.

Make it Happen

- Ensure enough adults in your unit have the right training for the planned activities.
- Identify who has what responsibility.
- Publish the calendar and share it with every family.
- Make extras for welcoming new families.
- Put it in your personal calendar.
- Refer to the unit calendar at every committee meeting.
- Evaluate monthly so all your families receive the maximum benefit from Scouting.

JOINING SCOUTING

When compared to the cost of sports and many other activities, there is no doubt that Scouting delivers great value to its members! The fees to join Scouting is \$85 annually, plus a \$24 insurance fee. In addition, there are uniform costs and nominal activity fees that may be charged by your local unit. Of course, these costs may be offset by unit fundraising and other available scholarship funds. Please contact your local unit leadership for details.

Cub Scouts

Cub Scouting is the entry-level program for Scouting. It is designed for boys and girls in grades K-5. In Cub Scouts children join a den based on their grade. Each grade has an animal or totem related to it: Kindergarteners are Lions, first graders are Tigers, second graders are Wolves, third graders are Bears, and fourth and fifth graders are Webelos.



Lions must be 5 years old by September 30 to participate.

Scouts BSA

To join a troop, a boy or girl must be 11 years old, or have completed the fifth grade, or earned Arrow of Light and be at least 10 years old, but not yet be18 years old.



Venturing and Sea **Scouts**

Venturing is an inclusive program through for males and females aged 14-20. It's operated through Venturing Crews and Sea Scout Ships, units of youth and advisors that meet on set schedules and plan activities and events. Venturing is about pursuing hobbies. Sea Scouts is about



HOW SCOUTS ADVANCE IN RANK

Rank advancement in Cub Scouting is not like rank advancement in Scouts BSA. And that's by design.

In Cub Scouting, advancement is grade- or age-based. Cub Scout ranks are a measure of a Scout's experience in Cub Scouting, and recognition that they've accomplished this year's objectives.

In Scouts BSA, though, Scouts hold the reins. They advance at their own pace — independent of grade, age or the progress of their fellow Scouts.

While there's a recommended speed at which ranks are completed, a Scout BSA member can advance at his or her own pace. The only real deadline: age 18, when a Scout is no longer a youth member of Scouting America

Cub Scout Advancement

The first badge all Cub Scouts (except those in the <u>Lion program</u>) earn, regardless of age, is the Bobcat badge. After earning Bobcat, Cub Scouts work on advancement for their grade or age level.

- **Bobcat**. First requirement to be accomplished for all grade levels.
- **Tiger**. For boys or girls who have completed kindergarten or are 7 years old.
- Wolf. For boys or girls who have completed first grade or are 8 years old.
- **Bear**. For boys or girls who have completed second grade or are 9 years old.
- Webelos. For boys or girls who have completed third grade or are 10 years old.
- Arrow of Light. For boys or girls who have completed fourth grade.

Cub Scouts do not go back and work on ranks designed for earlier grade levels, even if missed because of their time of joining. Likewise, Cub Scouts do not move ahead to the next rank until the completion of the current school year.

The highest rank, Arrow of Light, is earned as the Cub Scout leaves Cub Scouting and enters a Scouts BSA troop.

Scout BSA Advancement

Scouts BSA advancement isn't age- or grade-based. The Scout, with support and guidance from parents and Scout leaders, progresses at his or her own pace.

The Scouts BSA Handbook suggests that members earn the Scout rank "soon after joining." It goes on to say that earning Tenderfoot, Second Class and First Class should happen within the first 12 to 18 months of joining Scouts BSA.

At Star, Life and Eagle, Scouts tend to spread out a little bit. Some Scouts advance through those ranks quickly while others take their time. There's no right approach — every Scout is different.

Beginning at the Star rank, Scouting America adds time-based requirements:

Star: Active as a First Class Scout for at least four months; serve in a position of responsibility for at least four months.

Life: Active as a Star Scout for at least six months; serve in a position of responsibility for at least six months.

Eagle: Active as a Life Scout for at least six months; serve in a position of responsibility for at least six months.

SCOUTBOOK


Scoutbook is Scouting America's online unit management tool and helps Scouts, parents and leaders track advancement and milestone achievements along the Scouting trail. Scout book is for Packs, Troops, Crews, and Ships.

As of January 1, 2025, Scoutbook subscriptions are free to all Scouting units.

Some Advantages to Scoutbook:

- 1. You will have up to the minute visibility of your Scout's official Scouting America advancement record. You can view whenever you want. And the unit can make adjustments without contacting the council.
- 2. It automatically keeps the unit in compliance with Scouting America advancement reporting requirements.
- 3. When a Scout moves, their advancement record follows them.

If your unit has never used Scoutbook before, one of your Key 3 members, Key 3 Delegate, or Unit Advancement Chair, (these user roles are set in *my. scouting.org*) should login and setup permissions for the unit. The term "Key 3" is a Scouting America term, not a Scoutbook term. Key 3 refers to the team of the unit leader (Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, Crew Advisor or Ship Skipper), the unit Committee Chairman, and the Chartered Organization Representative.



AGE-APPROPRIATE GUIDELINES FOR SCOUTING ACTIVITIES

Age- and rank-appropriate guidelines have been developed based on many factors. When planning activities outside of program materials or handbooks, ask this question: Is the activity appropriate for the age and for Scouting? Not every activity peeds to be conducted.


