A MESSAGE FROM THE KEY 3:

The Silicon Valley Monterey Bay Council has embarked on an adventure it has never experienced before, doubling its membership over the next 3 years. Some might compare this endeavor to a hike; it's fraught with challenges, climbing new peaks, but in the end, the reward at the top will be a fantastic view of Scouting in our council, with membership it hasn't experienced in decades.

Locally, we are recognized as one of the most diverse and inclusive councils in the nation, setting the pace for the rest of Scouting America to follow. Our council has achieved top recognition every month in 2025, as measured by our membership, finance, training, camping, and programs. We saw continued significant growth in new Cub Scout Membership this year. Santa Cruz Sea Scout Ship 669 was selected as the Flagship for Sea Scouts, an honor never achieved by our council. Ship 669 awarded two Quartermaster Awards to Magnus Grigsby and Neli Fisher, with Grigsby earning both his Quartermaster Award and Eagle Scout Award, a feat only 1,000 youth in the history of the Scouting Program have ever achieved.

Camp Hi-Sierra experienced a second year of growth in 2025, with two weeks surpassing all-time attendance records. Our council's summer camp hosted Scouts BSA members from Florida, Arizona, Japan, Taiwan, and a record number from Southern and Central California. Camp Hi-Sierra's camper attendance for 2026 is well ahead of where we were a year ago, and we anticipate a third record season.

In 2025, through our Accelerated Growth Initiative, our council increased staff from 28 to 42. Our Field Operations Team grew, adding district executives for every district, with our first multi-person district in Coyote Creek. We added Unit Growth Executives to start new units and expanded our Marketing Efforts with a Director of Communications. Our new Character Counts Program launched in Salinas and offers a true Scouting Program in an area where Scouting hasn't existed for some years. Our Special Needs Program continues to grow and excel with new program opportunities.

We thank our Scouts, adult volunteers, leaders, Board of Directors, donors, and staff for all you have done to set the pace for another year of achievement, growth, and success. As we move toward 2026, we encourage you to join us and continue building on this adventure as we grow to offer Scouting to more youth than ever before. Thank you for helping us to shape young people of character who will become tomorrow's leaders.

Serving over 11,000 youth in the diverse communities of Santa Clara, Monterey, San Benito, and Santa Cruz Counties.



Financials reflective of 2025 end of year, pending the annual audit cycle.


INCOME
